4. CEN – Standardisation on Access to Technical Information – TF1 – part 2 and part 3:

4.1. Presentation and state of affairs of the CEN standardization project

4.2. How is EGEA affected?

In the context of our AFCAR activities on the technical implementation of the CEN standard, there is a debate on the question on how a single user PC could handle multiple applications requirements from all the different vehicle manufacturers. There are many problems of un-planned shut-downs, basic configuration requirements and presumption that IO's can be sufficiently IT competent. Within CEN, the group is specifying a 'standard' PC, but it could quickly become outdated as a technical specification. This is why it has been suggested that an equipment supplier, could provide a plug-in test/remote check of the PC's configuration to verify or re-configure the basic settings.

This would mean that the vehicle manufacturers' applications could be handled using a single PC, but only if each vehicle manufacturer's basic settings were known by the equipment manufacturer. This AFCAR/EGEA solution would allow the IO to handle the VM software, but without the problems of the IO workshop having to worry about basic configuration settings.

The aim of the EGEA WG 2 meeting is to discuss whether tool manufacturers would be prepared to take over such a role and what the requirements and opportunities would be.

4.3. New Point: SAE Confirmation – new J2534-2 API not compatible to 04.04 API

Information that the new J2534-2 API 05.05 release is not backward compatible to the 04.04 API release. Consequences, that our VCIs are compatible to one or the other, but not to both. Discussion on how to handle this.

5. New ISO Project: ISO/TC22/SC3/WG1 – ISO/TC 204/WG17 "Vehicle Station Gateway" (VSG) - (please see attached presentation)

The EGEA Secretariat has come across of this new project through its work as part of AFCAR (Alliance for the Freedom of Car Repair). With the AFCAR stakeholder group, we have been analysing how telematics is developing and how it is affecting the automotive aftermarket. As AFCAR, we have also developed proposals for an open and secure access to vehicle data. The VSG project seeks to establish the criteria through which access to the vehicle, either through telematics, or the 16 pin connector, is possible. This will directly impact EGEA Members.

This project creates a number of very critical questions concerning future accessibility to the vehicle for tool manufacturers. EGEA needs to analyse and discuss the best way forward, together with the consideration of the wider implications of this proposed standard. The aim is to adopt a common coordinated approach to this project.

5.3. How should EGEA position itself towards the VSG project? Coordination also with Members of the AFCAR Alliance (Alliance for the Freedom of Car Repair)
